






# WHATIS DISABILITY?

## BY THE NUMBERS

- 1.3 billion people with disabilities (WHO 2023)
- 1 in 6 people of the world's population is disabled (WHO 2023)



Persons with disabilities include those who have longterm physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others.

Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD, Article 1)

# HOW DOES THE CHURCH VIEW DISABILITY?

## MEDICAL MODEL

 The medical model of disability views disability as a defect that needs to be cured or managed.

# SOCIAL MODEL

 The social model of disability states that societal barriers and negative attitudes are the problem—not disability.


## MORAL MODEL

 A moral model argues that sin, karma, or the actions of the person or their family cause disability.

# ARE PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES WELCOME ATTHE TABLE?

"Go out at once into the streets and lanes of the city and bring in here those who are poor, those with disabilities, those who are blind, and those who are limping" (Luke 14:21 NASB).



Religious entities are exempt from Title III of the ADA that requires businesses and nonprofits to be accessible to people with disabilities.

### HOW TO WELCOME

- Is the location accessible?
- Is transportation available?
- Is an interpreter provided for the deaf?
- Have the needs of people with intellectual disabilities, autism, or learning differences (and their parents) been considered?

# REASONS FOR SENDING & SERVING

"The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. (I Cor. 12: 21-25 NIV).


# PHYSICAL AND SOCIAL NEEDS

- Access to public buildings and transportation (see CRPD, Article 9)
- Access to adequate housing (see CRPD, Articles 19 and 28)
- Access to mobility aids (see CRPD, Article 20)
- Access to education (see CRPD, Article 24)
- Access to employment opportunities (see CRPD, Article 27)
- Access to health care (see CRPD, Article 25)
- Access to recreational activities (see CRPD, Article 30)

# FINANCIAL NEEDS

Being disabled is expensive. The world charges us an additional price of admission. Imagine if instead of trying to pray away my body, Christian communities invested in making sure they didn't bankrupt me. Imagine if churches insured that no disabled person in their community paid the crip tax alone. Imagine if we were invested in one another's thriving enough to pick up the bill.... It's a way to undo the systems that keep disabled people down. It declares that we do not have to pay for the consequences of an inaccessible society all by ourselves.... It proves that you really do understand that you have been #blessed.




