A young 10-year old Victor had no idea, as he stood once again, begging in an underpass of Oradea, Romania, how one evening was going to impact both his own life and that of his family and wider community. The Mission Team, heading for Pizza, had no idea how that evening was going to impact their lives and that of a fledgling Christian Missions Foundation!

But God knew – He wrote the story!

On route to the restaurant, spotting Victor, the Team invited him to join them for dinner, where, through the interpreter, young Victor quietly shared something of his life and family situation. What happened following that meeting is a much longer story (which we would love to share with you!) but this was the start of a new chapter for both Victor and his community, as well as Kevin Hoy (Smiles Founder & CEO) and his heart to share the Good News of Jesus to the people of Romania, through The Smiles Foundation.



Kevin organised the first Smiles Mission Trip to Romania in 1996 and since then, over 4,000 people have attended Mission Trips with Smiles, serving alongside our Romanian staff who work year-round through several Outreach Projects - sharing the Gospel through Family Support for those living in poverty, the Homeless, organizing VBS's for local Community Children, formal Kindergarten for 3-6 year olds, Residential Care for the Elderly, Disabled and Vulnerable adults. We even have a Self-Sustainability project, involving a 50,000 sq. ft. Glasshouse, and subject to season, you can help us with the 1.7 million Plants and Bulbs grown each year.

Such has been the success and demand for Smiles Mission Trips, in 2004 we built our own Mission Center, a 32-bed facility with ensuite bathrooms, home-cooked food, BBQ area and swimming pool for the summer months. The Center also provides a relaxing recreational area with Snack Bar, Pool Table, and Meeting area for Team meetings with large-screen A/V system for teams to enjoy.
