

- List three major obstacles to thriving in Missional healthcare missions.
- Discuss a “balanced life” and ask if it a valid concept.
- Describe five themes in thriving during healthcare ministry.
- Describe one or two personal practices you want to focus on in the coming year.
- Discuss the cost of practicing healthcare in areas of the world where the mortality rate is high, and life is devalued.

- How healthcare providers can provide mission support on a short-term basis
