



I always wondered why we don't find more ways to praise and worship God through all things.

And that includes our ability to write, count and draw. Since my daughter, who has Down Syndrome, struggles in this area, I see our ability to communicate through words and pictures as a gift and blessing.

You can use this packet however you like but here are some tips.

- We use this as a daily warm-up, getting through multiple pages daily to remind her of what God did and build those beautiful fine motor skills and strength.
- At the beginning of each page we read together and she circles each word as she reads it. Through repetition and practice, every day gets better.
- Feel free to add colors, change up writing utensils (Markers, crayons, colored pencils), and add context to bring the meaning of each page to life.
- I also enjoyed writing and practicing on the back of each page, reinforcing skills that she struggles with or expanding on the topics that we are talking about. Feel free to do this and don't forget to be creative.


I want to encourage you to make this packet your own, perfect to meet the needs of your child in order for them to thrive and grow.

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



Dear Parents,

On the last four pages of each month, you will find word cards. Here are some fun games and activities you can do with these cards to help reinforce sight reading and phonics.

- Cut out the words from the word page. Have the child lay the word on top of the picture.
- Cut out the words and pictures. Play a matching game.
- Make two copies of the word cards (or picture cards) and play a matching game.
- After the child has had some practice with the words, lay out three of the word cards. The parent will call out one of the words and the child will find it. They can keep it or lay it on the picture page.
- On the word cards you can have them draw their own picture of the word on the back of each card.





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
