




GMHC CONFERENCE CAMPUS MAPS




Samaritan's Purse Emergency Field Hospital exhibit


You will receive an email soon after the GMHC with instructions and links. You will be able to log in to your MedicalMissions.com account and access it through your dashboard (or the email link).

Within this immersive experience, you will engage with interactive simulations, hear stories from the front lines, and witness the critical skills needed in effective emergency management. This experience not only educates but also inspires action and empathy, equipping you to make a difference in times of need. 
The full immersion experience is divided into two parts and is held in two different places. Be sure to visit both environments for unique disaster response insights:

1. Samaritan's Purse Field Hospital

- Located at the external doors to the right as you walk toward the entrance of the Worship Center
- Look for the Samaritan's Purse signage & you will be greeted by personnel to tour the field hospital, which is deployed all over the world during crises.

2. Disaster Immersion and Cleanup Kit Service Project

- Located in The Block student building. The immersion starts in the lobby (on the second floor open Thursday and Friday only).
- This walk-through experience will allow you to step into a simulation of natural & humanitarian disasters, learning how these events effect our local and global communities. Following that section of the experience, participants will then have the opportunity to be hands on with Convoy of Hope to assemble disaster cleanup & hygiene kits that will be deployed to natural disaster sites.



Partnership with the GMHC is no small thing and while you probably don't want to know all the ins and outs of what partnership entails, we certainly want to share some of the great things about how and why we partner with some of the most significant organizations in healthcare missions.

Partner Organizations Help Design GMHC Strategy



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

All of Jericho Road's global health clinics were started because of a desire from either a patient or staff member wanting to return to their country of origin to help "the ones who were left behind". These clinics are strategically placed in medically deprived, rural, and under-resourced communities and provide inpatient, outpatient, surgical (including C-sections), and outreach service



INNOVATIVE WAYS TO LEVERAGE HEALTHCARE SKILLS FOR EXPONENTIAL KINGDOM IMPACT

Jesus demonstrated repeatedly the connection between physical health and the gospel. This session will discuss innovative ways to leverage healthcare skills through the local church in frontier mission areas that creates exponential Kingdom impact.



INTEGRATING SPIRITUAL CARE INTO HEALTHCARE-AN EVIDENCE-BASED REVIEW

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MALARIA MITIGATION PROJECT IN RURAL UGANDA HEALTH CENTER

Despite great progress in eliminating malaria in the country, cases of malaria remain high in certain areas of Uganda. Understanding the epidemiology of cases and control is a vital component to a successful malaria mitigation project. Using a cloud-based electronic medical record we have created a pilot project to document and track malaria cases in a central Uganda health center. This type of technology can be utilized in other rural health centers to track malaria and other diseases.



MINIMIZING CULTURE SHOCK THROUGH STRUCTURED DEBRIEFING

Culture shock is one of the things those serving on cross-cultural missions may experience. There may not be a process in place for those serving to debrief the experience. POINT-OF-CARE ULTRASOUND: INTRODUCTION OF THE BASICS

Point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS) is the use of ultrasound by the bedside clinician to aid in diagnosing and managing conditions in their patients. Particularly in the mission field and in limited-resourced settings, this portable technology can greatly enhance diagnostic certainty as other diagnostic modalities may not be available. This 2-hour break-out session is aimed at participants with very limited or no medical knowledge and ultrasound experience. We will introduce the basics of ultrasound techniques and provide hands-on experience visualizing internal organs in the chest and abdomen. Preregistration required.



POINT-OF-CARE ULTRASOUND: ENHANCING YOUR SKILLS (ADVANCED)

This session is for those who have some experience in POCUS and would like to advance their skills.

Point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS) is rapidly growing to assist the bedside clinician in diagnosing and managing various medical conditions. With expanding number of portable and hand-held devices, POCUS is becoming more accessible to those in the mission field and in limited-resource settings. This 2-hour break-out session is aimed at participants with some medical knowledge or previous ultrasound experience as we will start to apply POCUS protocols to identify pathology. To maximize the participants' experience, we will need to limit the number of participants. Preregistration required.
