

INSTITUTE FOR INTERNATIONAL MEDICINE



SOME 5,000 SHORT-TERM HEALTHCARE TEAMS TRAVEL OUTSIDE THE US EACH YEAR



5-10 DAYS IN LENGTH, MOSTLY PROVIDING EPISODIC MEDICAL CARE

WHY ARE WE SO FASCINATED WITH THESE?



- Deep instinct to help people in need
- Excitement of cultures and travel



WHAT ARE SOME BENEFITS?



BENEFITS INCLUDE:

- Providing care for forgotten people
- Creating a vision for future service
- Expressing compassion
- Contributing to local healthcare infrastructure?



WHAT ARE SOME SHORTCOMINGS?



SHORTCOMINGS INCLUDE:

- Lack of understanding local conditions, language, culture
- Deficient continuity of care
- De-emphasis on preventive care
- Lack of contributing to longterm solutions

ARE SHORT-TERM HEALTHCARE MISSIONS EFFECTIVE?

- Our altruistic motives must be tempered by a reality check of whether they are indeed effective.
- By what criteria shall we measure such effectiveness?



POTENTIAL CRITERION

- Overall satisfaction of the participants?
- Overall satisfaction of the hosts?
- Number of services rendered?
- Acts of compassion?
- Increase in community's health status?



ASK OURSELVES...

- Is it effective to administer de-worming medication to children, and yet to not address the contaminated water they drink?
- Is it effective to diagnose an individual's diabetes, while there's no access to treatment, testing or followup care?



ASK OURSELVES...

- Is it effective to treat diarrheal disease among children but not to address their underlying malnutrition?
- Is it effective to treat malaria among children but not to providing bed nets to the families to prevent the malaria?



ARE SHORT-TERM HEALTHCARE MISSIONS ETHICAL?

POTENTIAL QUESTIONS

- Is it ethical to practice in another nation without a license?
- Is it ethical to allow students to care for people without the supervision they would receive in their home nations?



EXAMPLE ETHICAL ISSUE

"Our healthcare team saw a Honduran lady who was treated by an American physician for her chronic neuropathic pain with Neurontin samples. After the physician left, the lady developed severe adverse effects, with no one to care for her, let alone anyone who was familiar with the drug..."

EXAMPLE ETHICAL ISSUE

"While well intended, the physician's care was neither sustainable nor safe. Even if the drug had been effective, she would never be able to obtain it in Honduras. Using prudence in prescribing (limiting medications to those on the WHO Essential Drug List) and assuring that a local follow-up was in place may have helped avoid this precarious situation."

ARE SHORT-TERM HEALTHCARE MISSIONS CULTURALLY RELEVANT?

- What are some of the cross-cultural dilemmas encountered in we provide care for them?



"Our team traveled to South Africa, where almost every other person is HIV positive." Stanley, a public health specialist, expressed high hopes for their two-week journey. "I designed a presentation about sexual abstinence and condom use, and I gave it to several audiences. They all listened politely enough..."

"But later, an elder quietly explained to me that Zulu males are instructed and expected to initiate sexual activity before even reaching their teen years. How could I be an effective educator when I knew almost nothing about sexuality in their society?"




"A young mother returned to our mobile clinic saying 'My babies are crying uncontrollably and are feverish. Yesterday, you put a curse on them when I brought my babies for vaccinations! Your evil eye is black magic!' The lady glared at me, and I had no idea what she was talking about."



"After the mother left in a torrent of screaming my translator asked, 'Doctor, when you examined her babies did you touch them fondly? Touch is necessary to express genuine affection. Without such touch, you only communicate envy that what you really want is for the babies to be dead."




PROVISION OF HUMAN POWER

- Emergency care


Always in collaboration with, and ideally, under direction of a national host

MATERIALS FOR ASSISTING

- Textbooks & teaching aids
- Critical/essential medications
- Appropriate technology
- Plumbing/electrical
- Information access
- Disaster aid



PARTNERSHIP EXAMPLE: ASK "WHAT SUBJECTS CAN I HELP TO TEACH?"



SUBJECTS FOR EFFECTIVE SHORT-TERM TEACHING

- Newborn resuscitation
- Management of obstetrical complications
- Cardiac life support
- Trauma life support



PARTNERSHIP EXAMPLE: ASK "WHAT SPECIAL SERVICES ARE NEEDED?"



EFFECTIVE SPECIAL SERVICES

- Dental Care
- Eye Care
- Surgery for disabilities/burns
- Fistula repair


